<u>A Message from the Gurnett's</u>

Greetings! Liz and I shared a video message this week (<u>This is the video link</u>), over email to our church community, but in case you didn't get the chance to see/hear it, here is a copy of what we said; some news from our family:

Liz and I would like to share something with you.

In my late teens and early 20s, I used to be part of a College and Career retreat weekend at MeadowLodge Bible Camp, just east of Edmonton, a sister camp to our Bethel Bible Camp, here in Westlock.

One year, when I was 20, at the retreat we were playing a game – it was either soccer or football, I don't remember. Anyways, somehow the 2 teams ended up being Westlock vs. Edmonton. Westlock didn't have quite enough players, and as I knew a number of people from Westlock because of my involvement with Bethel, I ended up being on the Westlock team.

Little did I know then that 10 years later, I'd become a real part of the Westlock team, when I moved here to be the pastoral worker in 1990. And Liz, the next year, when we married. Westlock has been home for almost 30 years now, which is hard to believe.

That time is coming to an end, however.

There's never a good time to say such a thing, and we certainly didn't want to do this via a video message, but the times have dictated that for us. It has been a journey to come to what we have to say today, but at the end of June I will be stepping aside from duties here at the Westlock Gospel Chapel, as our family grows and transitions and we haven't been there nearly enough for them, which we deeply desire to do.

We don't know exactly what God has in store, and we know that we will miss you all so much; yet still, now is the time. We will still be around, through the end of June and some in the summer – give us a call, or drop by. We'll be glad to see you. Or, once we're settled (interim) in the city, drop by and see us there.

At the Chapel, we trust that God will continue to do a great work here. He has provided in the past, and will continue to do so.

We are so thankful for all you have come to mean to us over the years.

<u>A Pastoral Reflection and Devotion</u> - (May 22, 2020)

Finding Purpose in Everything

I started reading a book this week that describes the life of a monk from the 17th century who was crippled during war and spent the rest of his life in chronic pain. However, the life of this monk was not remarkable because of his physical disability and constant pain, but because he sought to be in constant communication with the Lord. In everything he did, he attempted to be communing with the Father, talking to Him and enjoying Him.

I find such a lifestyle challenging because I don't have the same continued focus on the Lord and an ongoing, never-ending conversation with Him. God knows everything I am thinking, doing and saying (He knew it before the world was created), yet often He doesn't hear it from my lips.

I'll be honest, this isn't a reflection on God, it is a reflection of my own relationship with the Lord. It should be the utmost desire of my heart to worship the Lord without stopping for breath, to pray without ceasing, and to read His Word with pure devotion and focus. I don't say this because I'm a pastor or because it's an external goal to reach, but rather, given all the Lord has done and who He is, this is just what He deserves!

The verses that come to mind as I think about this idea are 1 Cor 10:31 and Col 3:17. Both of these verses speak about the act of glorifying God in whatever we do. When we genuinely practice these verses we begin to find purpose in everything, because everything becomes an opportunity to glorify God. This means doing the dishes, eating a meal, spending time with your children/grandchildren, spending time in prayer, studying the Bible and <u>whatever</u> else we do.

Coming back to the idea of constant communication with the Lord, I think if I am in ongoing conversation with God it will become natural to do all things to glorify Him, because He's already on my lips and the centre of my attention. Such a lifestyle will also form a resistance to temptation, because when the Lord is the focus of our thoughts, sin is further from us.

Furthermore, focusing on the Lord takes away the constant battle of thinking about oneself. What joy we should have when we think about the Lord, what peace we should experience when we trust in Him, and what love we should demonstrate when we recognize His love for us.

How is your communication with the Lord? How focused are you on glorifying God in <u>everything</u> you do? If it's lacking, know that you're not alone. However, after admitting this we should also consider how to grow in this area.

So, how am I trying and would suggest we all grow? 1) Repent; 2) Seek the Lord to increase your desire for Him and to glorify Him; 3) Remove obstacles that may interfere with time constraints or distract your focus (e.g. excess technology time, too much sleep) and 4) Just do it, start conversation with the Lord this very minute and focus on glorifying Him in all you do.

<u>Note:</u> There will be no access to the library during the Sunday morning services. A drop-off box will be available for returning items only.


