Lockdown: In France, we have been in strict lockdown from mid-March till mid-May. We are now able to go out to stores, but meetings are still disallowed as well as traveling more than 100km from our home. Here are some of the bad and good aspects we have experienced during this time:

- about 30,000 French people have died in this epidemic
- not being able to go and visit our children and grand children
- no « real » fellowship through physical gatherings with believers

The good :

- spending lots of time together as a couple in a pleasant living space and in good health
- discovering new ways of sharing the Gospel through video conferences. We have actually seen an increase in people « attending » Sunday services.

- Reaching across oceans : Brad was able to preach « in » a Church service in Canada and share in a Missions meeting « in » Hong Kong ! Our international students have mostly flown home but continue to connect to our Bible Studies from places like Taiwan, Korea, Slovakia, Denmark, Germany ... Most of them are not yet believers, please pray !









- Giving pastoral care and doing discipleship through video conference. Catherine has been busy morning to evening calling people to get their news, praying and training.

- Brad was able to work more on his commentary.

On the road again ...

There is a need for church planting in Manosque, a city of about 60,000 people with only one evangelical church. We prayed about it and the Lord showed us that He wants us to go there. In the week we decided we should go, God provided two young tent making couples to help us in the project! Lord willing, we plan to move in the summer of 2021. <u>A Pastoral Reflection and Devotion</u> - (May 29, 2020)

Government Restrictions on Church

There are a lot of views (and conspiracy theories) right now regarding COVID-19, including opinions about the response from churches. I wanted to briefly take some time to share my thoughts about the restrictions and freedoms we have been given from the AB government during phase 1 of relaunching Alberta.

Last week I was part of a call initiated by the government, which included over 1000 religious leaders in the province. For two hours we were involved in discussion with Premier Jason Kenney and Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Hinshaw regarding the reopening of churches. This conversation followed the announcement and guidelines upon places of worship (and other businesses) to reopen.

Overall I was very encouraged by the conversation and the respectful and humble response the Premier and Dr. Hinshaw demonstrated. I think it is noteworthy that at the time of the call we were the only province (and likely only state in North America) to receive permission to gather in groups larger than the restricted number for other indoor gatherings. This seems to indicate recognition of the priority and necessity of faith based meetings from a government point of view and their commitment to listen to the requests of the faith based community.

In saying this, some people have still argued for a form of prejudice or persecution upon churches because of the differences in restrictions between restaurants and churches. After listening to the answers from the government to these questions, I'm satisfied the reasons for such differences are practical, rather than prejudicial (even if some of them aren't fully thought out).

For example, the patrons at a restaurant are generally not gathered together for a large social gathering, but a small party. This means contact is expected to be minimal between diners who are not at the same table. On the other hand, a church meeting is a purposeful meeting among all members in attendance and interaction is likely between all in attendance. Those who eat at a restaurant can also often be contacted via information provided with their credit card should an outbreak occur, whereas an attendance record for churches was suggested (not mandatory) to contact individuals should an outbreak occur, because such contact information is not available via credit card.

I do believe the government recognizes the importance of church in people's lives and they listened to the majority of callers on the meeting who called for church attendance to be based on seating capacity. Therefore, I'm hopeful, and we should be in prayer, that the number of people who can attend is increased as phase 2 begins. In the same way I'm optimistic singing will be welcome (even if it has to be with masks on).

I admit there's much not to like about the restrictions on us, yet, we are instructed in Romans 13 to submit to the government (unless it clearly contradicts Scripture). Therefore, following God's command should be a joy, a privilege and a necessity, even if we don't like what we're instructed to do. We are in a unique time of world history, yet Scripture remains relevant and it must be accepted as the authority in the lives of believers. Realistically, this does not apply only to our response to COVID, but in every area of our lives.

Finally, if you have questions, suggestions or concerns over the way the government or the elders have handled this situation I'd certainly be happy to chat through these with you. I would only ask that you first consider your motivation to share and that you be in prayer for both the government and the elders at WGC. As believers we should also ensure we follow the biblical instruction to think of others as more important than ourselves (Phil. 2:3-4) and not judge others for their personal views on COVID and how Christians should respond (e.g. Rom. 14; 1 Cor. 10:23-33). However, I certainly don't have all the answers and have much to learn, so I'd be glad to chat with you if we can constructively and biblically see the Gospel advance in our lives and the community.
