Application of Phil 4:10-20

1. Are you content with your financial situation?
 - a. Does money control your thoughts and actions or do you have confidence in God's provision?
 - b. Do you believe God owes you certain material possessions or that you deserve to be financially comfortable?
 - c. Are you content with possessions that aren't new, the latest style or the popular brands?
2. How does Paul's attitude of being content whether he has lots or nothing challenge you to live your life?
3. Do you regularly give financially to Gospel focused ministry e.g. the church, missions?
4. Do you understand your money is God's money and you are the steward of it, not the owner? Reassess in prayer how you are spending/saving/giving His money to determine if your perspective on money and financial habits need to change
5. What is your motivation for giving? E.g. To honor God, bless others, advance the Gospel, receive eternal rewards OR for a tax receipt, to receive greater material wealth, to feel good?
