Setting of Forgiveness (Prelude)	
1. Cry for Forgiveness (vv. 1-2)	 When you sin make sure you acknowledge your sin to God and ask for His forgiveness, because first and foremost your sin is against God
The basis for forgiveness is God's	3. When you do the wrong thing do you try making excuses, blame others or minimize your actions? David's example teaches us about accepting full responsibility of sin, confessing sin wholeheartedly and requesting God brings internal change
2. Need for Forgiveness (vv. 3-6)	4. Because you are forgiven, in what way do/can you tell others about God's forgiveness and thank God for His forgiveness?
3. Extent of Forgiveness (vv. 7-12)	5. Pray for one person each day this week, asking God to strengthen them to withstand temptation and for a growing and fruitful relationship with God and ministry for Him.
4. Proclamation of Forgiveness (vv. 13-15)	6. Because we are blessed by God's forgiveness we are also to forgive others who sin against us (e.g. Matt 6:12, 13-14; Eph 4:32). Is there anyone you need to forgive?
5. Offering for Forgiveness (vv. 16-19)	Reading this week: Read 2 Samuel 11-12 for the historical context of this psalm. Read Ps 51 each day this week.
