Application of Psalm 96

- 1. In Sunday worship do you focus on and sing to the Lord? Or do you sing for others? If you choose not to sing, how do you justify the repeated instruction in the Bible that tells us to sing?
- 2. What are the 'marvellous things' God has done in your life that you can sing a new song for or witness to others about?
- 3. In what ways can you support a world wide witness, that God's glory would be declared among the nations? E.g. give, go, pray
- 4. How can the reminder that the LORD reigns help you this week?
- 5. How do you feel about the promise that Jesus will return and judge the earth (e.g. excited, scared, unsure)? What can you do to increase your sense of excitement (e.g. Read Scripture, study the subject, talk with other believers about it, think about it)?

<u>Reading this week:</u> 1 Chronicles 16 provides a possible historical context for this psalm because this song is very similar to the Psalm. Read Ps 96 each day this week.
